
What is clear from the very beginning of the EUSDR coordination (PA1b)?

- How to build a basis for cooperation with all the stakeholders which may contribute to the EUSDR objectives in the area of transport (and some other priority areas)

Where and how to start?




- From already achieved results, good practicies
 - Vision Slovenia (2002-2003)
 - PRELUDE
- From some basic criteria
 - Stakeholder participation (how many citizens even know that there is the EUSDR)
 - Sustainable development (transport as an integral part how to deal with transport not knowing where the region would like to go)
 - Cohesion
 - Competent team

- EEA (PRELUDE experience)
 - -The first project idea has been developed
 - Flow of information started
 - -WWF
 - -VOLANTE



Work done so far



- Slovenia proposed a project "Scenarios and transition pathways to sustainable mobility in Danube region" (in cooperation with the EEA)
- PACs 1b prepared a document "A COMMON TRANSPORT VISION"
- Discussed at the Steering group meeting (Belgrade -June, 2012)
- Workshop (Belgrade September 2012) on how to realize the project

WE HAVE THE TOR



- A way on how to achieve the objective build the foundation of the building
 - Results in a short time period
 - Consistent
 - Process instead of a big book of wishes
 - Professional team behind
 - Time to answer all remaining questions
 - To agree what to do if the proposed way is OK
- Is there a need to look for another way towards the objective?



- Where are the important transport links that need to be established to prepare the region for tomorrow's markets? How do these transport links need to look like?
- Could the region be served with one or several major hubs for air traffic? Where would such hub best be developed?
- Are high speed train connections through the region desirable, e.g. between Vienna and Istanbul, and between Dubrovnik and Kiev? How about the feasibility and economic profitability of these connections?
- Modern motorway connections connecting within the region are largely absent. Are these a viable option to connect major cities in the region? If yes, how could these best be developed, where and how?
- How do transport needs within the region link-up to the EU as a whole and to the neighbouring countries of the region outside the EU?
- What are the innovative technologies that need to be planned for and applied?
- How can the financing and economic, environmental and social viability of the transport links be ensured?
- How could decision-making on the myriad of transport options within the region be supported by a rational and shared set of instruments?



EUDSR and transport

- a multi-player situation
- a highly diverse region with difficult transport issues
- interconnection between transport and many other topics
 å areas
- lots of changes in transport ahead

The **challenge**:

How to create a sound, forward looking transport strategy with commitment by the diverse parties involved?



One way

- top down strategy development
- among the parties involved
- focused on where we are and what we do now

The outcome:

Delivers descriptions that - at most - will be put into reality because these were planned anyhow



The other way

- participatory strategy development
- involving stakeholders across the region
- in a process that takes on the future

The outcome:

Delivers a specific reference for action by and for parties across the macro-region with a high chance for broad buy-in and compliance



Going the other way

Shared vision What we want	The desired future we want to reach for transport in the Danube region
Scenarios What could happen to us	The range of possible circumstances beyond our influence that we might face - wanted or not - when trying to make the vision happening.
Strategy & Roadmap How we get through	What we have to do and how in order to reach reach the vision through in the possible circumstances (scenarios) over time;
Engagement & implentation Making it happen	Doing it and involving further groups in the process in order to make the vision reality



Envisaged outcomes include

- RESPONSES TO THE CHALLENGES FOR TRANSPORT in the macro-region emphasised in the TOR
- DEVELOPMENT & TESTING of OPTIONS, PRIORITIES & STRATEGIES for transport in the macro-region
- A REFERENCE SYSTEM for decision-making by MULTIPLE PARTIES, GOVERNMENT AND FURTHER
- NETWORKS of ACTIVE PLAYERS involved in the future of transport in the macro-region
- COMMITMENT AND INTEREST TO PUT THE ACITIVITIES INTO PRACTICE



Yet what about...

Achieving realistic and implementable results?	Yes, absolutely, putting strategy into practice
Specific input to transport decision-making and planning?	Indeed - at the level and specification agreed & almed for
Incorporation of already existing plans & knowledge?	Yes, as one input to the process - not as its outcome or replacement
Buy-in and participation on the national level?	Key point: lots of activities foreseen here - can be further expanded
Is it worth the investment?	How much is the value of buy- in? How much is spent on transport in the region?
