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Milestones since last Working Group meetings

- ✓ 1 July 2013: Publication of evaluation of EU macro-regional strategies by the European Commission
- ✓ June 2013: Second progress report finalised by PACs 1a; including progress report on implementation of Luxembourg Declaration on effective waterway infrastructure maintenance
- ✓ 28-29 October 2013, EUSDR Annual Forum Bucharest
 - More than 900 high-level participants from the region, including ministers, showing the commitment of the countries to the Strategy











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Targets for PA 1a

- (1) Increase the <u>cargo transport</u> on the river by 20% by 2020 compared to 2010.
- (2) Solve <u>obstacles to navigability</u>, taking into account the specific characteristics of each section of the Danube and its navigable tributaries and establish effective <u>waterway infrastructure management</u> by 2015.
- (3) Develop efficient <u>multimodal terminals at river ports</u> along the Danube and its navigable tributaries to connect inland waterways with rail and road transport by 2020.
- (4) Implement harmonised <u>River Information Services</u> (RIS) on the Danube and its navigable tributaries and ensure the international <u>exchange of RIS data</u> preferably by 2015.
- (5) Solve the shortage of <u>qualified personnel</u> and harmonize <u>education standards</u> in inland navigation in the Danube region by 2020, taking duly into account the social dimension of the respective measures.








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Waterway Infrastructure – next steps



- ✓ Revision of Guidelines for the EU's Trans-European Transport Network and the Connecting Europe Facility for 2014 to 2020 → Presentation by the EC's DG MOVE
 - Danube as Corridor 9 is part of the "core network" (now also includes the Danube-Black Sea Canal)
 - TEN-T core network shall be established by 2030
- Implementation of waterway infrastructure projects
- Stronger cooperation with PA6 on Biodiversity





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Waterway Management – status



- **Declaration** on effective waterway infrastructure maintenance on the Danube and its navigable tributaries signed in June 2012 during the Danube **Ministers Meeting**
- ✓ Monitoring of implementation in the framework of the EUSDR's PA 1a ongoing
- ✓ Study on extreme weather events on waterways
 - → Presentation by via donau/Nina Siedl

- ✓ Discussion of short-term measures planned for 2014 in 6th meeting of PA 1a Steering Group (21 November 2013) + Next update round for questionnaire on maintenance needs and plans directly after Steering Group meeting
- ✓ Proposal for appeal of the Steering Group on the implementation of the Luxemburg Declaration
- ✓ Masterplan on waterway maintenance on the Danube created within NEWADA duo project → Presentation by via donau/Thomas Hartl
- ✓ Solutions for ship waste management on the Danube
 - → Presentation by via donau/Hans Berger








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Fleet Modernisation






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Education and Jobs – qualifications






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Administrative Processes – status



- ✓ New initiative within PA 1a in cooperation with PA11 on Security
- ✓ Administrative processes and paperwork are a significant competitive disadvantage for IWT on the Danube and its tributaries
- ✓ Background: not all Danube riparian states are in the EU; not all EU states are in the Schengen area, i.e. necessary border checks for passengers & crews; required customs clearance for imports & exports
- ✓ First dedicated meeting on 25 September 2013 to identify the main administrative barriers which cause the highest costs and lead to the highest time losses
