Danube Region Programme - 3rd call pre-announcement

The Danube Region Programme is announcing their third call for proposals. The call will be thematically targeted, open in mid-September and close on 15 December 2025. More information, such as thematic focusses and webinars can be found on their website.

Update of the Joint Statement

The Joint Statement, originally adopted in 2007, outlines principles and recommendations to ensure that navigation development is perused in an environmentally, economically, and socially sustainable manner. The update process of the Joint Statement was initiated by the Sava Commission, Danube Commission, and International Commission for the Protection of the Danube River (ICPDR). The goal of the update is to continue the implementation of an integrated approach to river corridor management and to foster more resilient Danube and Sava river basins, capable of adapting to climate change impacts like floods, droughts, and low water levels.

Following the first stakeholder workshop on the update of the Joint Statement in September 2024, a second stakeholder workshop took place in January 2025. PA1a has provided feedback alongside the shipping sector. The feedback is currently being incorporated into the final version of the Joint Statement 2.0, which is planned to be presented in autumn.

We will keep you informed on the process towards a Joint Statement 2.0.

Annual Construction and Navigation Meeting





On 15th May 2025, the annual national Construction and Navigation Meeting took place in the port of Enns (Austria). The meeting focused on recent and future developments along the Danube waterway, focussing on the upper Danube. Particular attention was given to the lasting impacts after the September 2024 floods, which caused extensive damage but also led to valuable lessons in prioritizing emergency responses and improving infrastructure resilience—such as the development of optimized navigation buoys and faster, more targeted maintenance strategies.

Hosted by viadonau, the meeting brought together participants and speakers from the Austrian, Slovakian and German waterway operators and representatives from the shipping sector.

Out Now: Report on Good Navigation Status 2024



To support the implementation of the Fairway Rehabilitation and Maintenance Masterplan for the Danube and its navigable tributaries, which remains a cornerstone of coordinated Danube navigation development, we are pleased to share the Updated Reports on Good Navigation Status (GNS)/National Action Plans 2025.

This annual report illustrates the status of selected GNS components in the Danube riparian countries. The report provides a consistent, transnational overview of the Danube waterway's status and development efforts.

The first half of the year 2024 was marked by favourable conditions from a hydrological perspective. The second half of the year was characterised by strong fluctuations in the water level. The second of two flood events in September posed particular challenges for the waterway authorities on the Upper and Middle Danube. On the other hand, the Lower Danube benefitted from the receding flood wave, which ended the ongoing low water period.

Workshop on the fairway conditions in 2024 and Expert Meeting on Hydrotechnical Matters

The Danube Commission, together with EUSDR Priority Area 1a, organized a joint workshop titled "Review of Fairway Conditions on the Danube in 2024" on 4th March 2025 in Budapest. The event was held back-to-back with the annual expert meeting on hydrotechnical matters.

At the workshop on fairway conditions participants discussed national maintenance activities, assessed fairway conditions, and reviewed the progress of the CEF cofunded "FAIRway Danube II" and "FAST DANUBE 2" projects. Furthermore, the workshop provided a platform for valuable input from shipping companies. Mr. Herbert Pribitzer (European Commission, DG MOVE) emphasized the importance of enhancing the resilience of inland waterways in response to climate change, which is increasingly affecting the Danube's hydrological conditions.

On the next day, the annual expert meeting on hydrotechnical issues, organised by the Danube Commission, took place. The core of the meeting was the presentation and discussion of the planned activities of the participating countries. Additionally, information on major works and information services was shared.

Workshop on Actions towards zero-emission Danube Fleet

Following the initial workshop in October 2024, PA1a and the Danube Commission jointly held a follow-up event on 12th March 2025 in Budapest, gathering stakeholders from the inland waterway transport sector.

Building on fleet data, insights from the initial workshop and discussions on possible

transition pathways and implementation barriers, PA1a and the Danube Commission presented a set of concrete actions aimed at achieving a zero-emission Danube fleet. The workshop focused on proposed short- and mid-term policy strategies, with participants openly discussing their feasibility and impact.

PA1a and the Danube Commission will continue refining actions to support the fleet's green transition, using the workshop outcomes to guide next steps.
